IMPORTANT NOTICES AND REMINDERS!

The Community has many rules and regulations. We wish to bring the top three rules to the attention of all Residents at Marquee Park Place.

- **NO PET BUILDING.** There are no pets allowed at Marquee, not even visitors.
- **NO SMOKING BUILDING.** There is no smoking in the common areas at Marquee. Do NOT throw your cigarette butts onto the common area or someone's balcony. You will cause a fire!
- **NO RESIDENT VEHICLE PARKING ON VISITOR LEVEL.** Every resident is deeded two parking spaces at Marquee. You will need to arrange outside parking for your extra vehicles.

Enforcement is imposed by the Board of Directors and can result in the following: a) seek remedy by use of the legal system; b) charge monetary penalties against the homeowner; c) the Association may correct and charge the homeowner for reimbursement of costs for damages; d) suspend homeowner's voting and common area privileges or; e) a combination of the foregoing.
